#### IMPACTFUL ONLINE EDUCATION

On 31st May, a virtual meet held to provide training to the staff members highlighting the technologies like Mentimeter, Survey heart, Quilgo. The session started by greeting Father Shaiju Chacko. Session reframed the effective learning strategies, innovative teaching methods etc. At the beginning of the session, Father told the staff members about Mentimeter, where a teacher can engage students using word cloud, multiple-choice questions, making teaching more interactive by letting the students participate effectively.

In the survey heart application, he told us how to create forms and polls for our surveys to make effective learning. It has predefined templates with suitable themes. He also gave a peep in Google Add-on that embeds a timer into Google Forms and collects form submission time. All the teachers participated actively and appreciated Father for an innovative and interactive session.

#### **AWARENESS OF NEP 2020**

Mr. Rudolf Noronha, Principal at DRS INTERNATIONAL SCHOOL Hyderabad, gave valid input on "National Education Policy 2020" on 1st June 2021. With the help of various new techniques like Jamboard, menitmeter etc; he briefed the highlights of NEP. He further discussed the NEP Expectations from School-which will Enhance and enrich each student's learning through innovative pedagogy, Focus on core -essentials/learning outcome, Stress on the importance of foundational skills of literacy and numeracy. Bringing changes in the assessment pattern shown through the video was was an interesting one.

# VIRTUAL TEACHING STRATEGY

The Carmel Convent teachers participated in an online training program on the VIRTUAL TEACHING STRATEGY conducted by Ms. Ferzine (TOK Coordinator at DRS INTERNATIONAL SCHOOL and IB, Geneva) on 7th June 2021. The objective of the training was to equip the teachers with varieties of activities in teaching and learning by using technology tools like Jamboard and SlidesMania. She demonstrated designing digital notebooks, essential agreements, etiquettes, defining goals and outcomes and designing. She taught a new way of keeping the students eager by telling the staff to See-think-wonder strategy and entry-exit tickets.

# **MULTIPLE INTELLIGENCE WEBINAR**

A bunch of teachers had the advantage of attending a webinar on Multiple Intelligence that lasted from 3 to 5 June 2021. Margarette Warner - founder of MAW education in Oxford who has created teacher training methods using modern Multiple Intelligences technique was the resource person. We got to learn a lot of new things during this webinar. She gave a clear vision of 'The Theory of Multiple Intelligences by Dr. Howard Gardner and explained how different children had different styles of learning. The nine major areas of Multiple Intelligence namely: Linguistic, Interpersonal, Intrapersonal, Naturalistic, Bodily-kinesthetic, Logical-mathematical, Musical, Spatial and Existential discussed during the session.

The teachers were made familiar with the importance of assessing the Multiple Intelligence in all the students through simple observations, school records, interaction with parents and peers. The teacher being a constructive facilitator, she needs to maintain a positive attitude towards students' differences and focus on learning not on teaching.





















# **LKG**



# **Class V**



# Class IX & X


