75TH INDEPENDENCE DAY

Carmel Convent School, Jammu celebrated the 75th Independence Day on 15 August 2020, virtually with the school community contributing remotely online from home.

The highlight of the virtual ceremony was the speech from the District Collector of Jammu, Mr. Anshul Garg, IAS. He congratulated and praised the Principal for her hard work, dedication and efforts to reach the school to great heights.

Digital Transformation Using New Technologies

"Digital Transformation using new technologies" organized by CBSE, affirmed how the COVID-19 pandemic has been transformative as education providers looking forward to implementing technology solutions to enable remote teaching and learning. Educational institutions are engaged in providing hybrid learning to students. In this context, an enriching session on several points was discussed on Digital Transformation using emerging technologies.

Fundamental Literacy & Numeracy

Reading, writing and numeracy are always believed to be the foundational skills; without being able to read, write well and do basic calculations a child cannot progress in the education system and eventually in life. The major policy documents always pointed towards the need to consider early language, literacy and numeracy more seriously. A good foundation of literacy and numeracy skills has a positive impact on the learning of the child in senior classes and also develops a child's interest in learning. An enriching session on "Fundamental Literacy & Numeracy" was organized by CBSE under the Ministry of Education's NIPUN BHARAT Mission.



Assessing Assessment

In this seminar, Asllesha Thakur, the resource person highlighted the importance of effective assessment for the virtual class. She explained the purpose of doing assessments under National Educational policy by sharing different types of activities like learning intentions and success criteria, understanding feedback, when should the assessment be done. Asllesha asked to rely on Formative Assessment rather than Summative Assessment by introducing different types of tools. She further gave the clear concept of using rubrics and assessment data to increase the quality of the teaching/ learning process.

Empowering Teachers

The seminar was organised by Tata ClassEdge Academy and the key speaker was Richa Hora. The points which were discussed in the session were

- How teachers were trained on virtual teaching during the lockdown, and how Virtual Teaching Mastery was launched in July 2020.
- The seminar aimed to train and empower teachers who play an important role in bringing out the best in every student.
- Later on, she highlighted training methodologies, Training Modules, Teacher Empowerment Programs.

School Quality Assessment and Assurance

The webinar was helpful for all the teachers to meets the needs of SAQQ. To improve, the standard of School the focus has to be on performance and improvement. SQAA help in monitoring identified outcome at all levels and across all spheres of school education. It would help teachers, educational administrators and all other stakeholders involved in school education to form this exercise and improve themselves. SQAA is holistic and covers all aspects of School functioning.

Protection of Child Rights

Mrs. Geeta Shukla, the resource person talked about children right. Violence against children continues to be a serious and prevalent issue globally. When considering the need for child protection mechanisms to be implemented, we should consider the extent of violence perpetrated against children and how the statistics are reflected in the reality of children's life experiences in the country.

Strategies in Science (Secondary level)

The seminar covered an overview of teaching strategies in science (applied to both physical & life science) & updates with innovative tools & features used while teaching science. The various key points of the web seminar were Students engagement, STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, & Maths), Hands-on experiments, use of video clips, podcasts, concept charts & maps, Clickers & other virtual tools.

SAFAL (Structured Assessment for Analysing Learning)

CBSE has launched SAFAL, a competency based assessment for grades 3, 5 and 8 to assess the progress of foundational skills and basic learning outcomes/ competencies among students. SAFAL, as a diagnostic assessment, will provide developmental feedback to schools and teachers to improve teaching learning. SAFAL will be conducted on a pilot basis in CBSE schools for students in grade 3, 5 and 8 during the academic year 2021-22, in key curricular areas of language, Mathematics and Science/EVS.

Early Childhood Education

An online webinar was conducted for primary teachers on the topic-" Early Childhood Education". The training session was organised by Tata class edge and the session was connected through Microsoft teams. Agenda of the Session was Skill Building in early years, Importance of Storytelling and Values and Components.

Virtual Engagement Mastery

A special interactive pre training session was organised in order to brief us about the whole programme. On 24th August our resource person Mr. Naga Durgesh instructed us to install 'Mind Map App' on our laptops and explained us the benefits of mind mapping. It is a great tool to be used in our class while teaching because it retains in the memory of the students for longer period. Teaching through Mind Mapping is easy and effective

21st Century Skills

The speaker Dr. Anjna Gupta emphasized on the need to implement certain strategies to make the students skilled, selfregulating and responsible citizen. There is a need to adapt and develop different ways to teach and learn that would reflect the changing environment. She spoke of 6 key components i.e. Globally active, Digitally Transforming, Collaborative, Creative, Competent and Adaptive that will contribute to the holistic development of an individual in 21st century, thus, could contribute to the development of nation and world.

Assessment Reforms with Special Reference to CBSE Schemes of 2021-22

The webinar organized by the chairman of CBSE Schools to meets the need for a new pattern of Assessment for high school and higher secondary children. The speakers emphasized that improving the way of assessments will improve the standards of School education. The focus has to be shifted on the performance and improvement of children rather than evaluating them based on percentages. The main focus of the session was to help the educators, teachers in monitoring and identifying the outcomes at all levels and across all spheres of school education.

Teaching Strategies of English (Secondary Level)

In this seminar the teachers learned that it is an immersive reading activity. Instead of focusing on formal acquisition of literary concepts alone through, engage your students through creative immersion activities. The Objectives of teaching English in the schools will be the acquisition of linguistic and communicative skills.

Behaviour problems in school

Webinars conducted by ICTRC. The resource person, Dr V.S Ravindran, on Behaviour problems in school and student risk were extremely enlightening and enabled the participants to become aware of the behavioural changes occur during these crises moments and reinforced the important of reinforcement of expectable behavior in the given situation.

Selection of Effective Teaching-Learning Materials

In this seminar, Dr Jagdish Sharma highlighted different types of teaching and learning materials that can be used by both the facilitator and the learner. Some are expensive while others are relatively cheap and can be produced by the learners themselves. A lesson is more effective and useful to the learners when teaching and learning are done with the help of things that can be seen, heard and touched. TLMs make lessons enjoyable and memorable. Teaching and learning materials are not a complete method of teaching but an aid to learning.

Skilling in School

It was very informative webinar on introducing vocational education in schools. The speakers stressed on the importance and values of introducing skilling in school were more emphasis was given on teaching children through learning by doing method, which automatically not only improve their basic academic knowledge but also enable them to become professionally well equipped.
