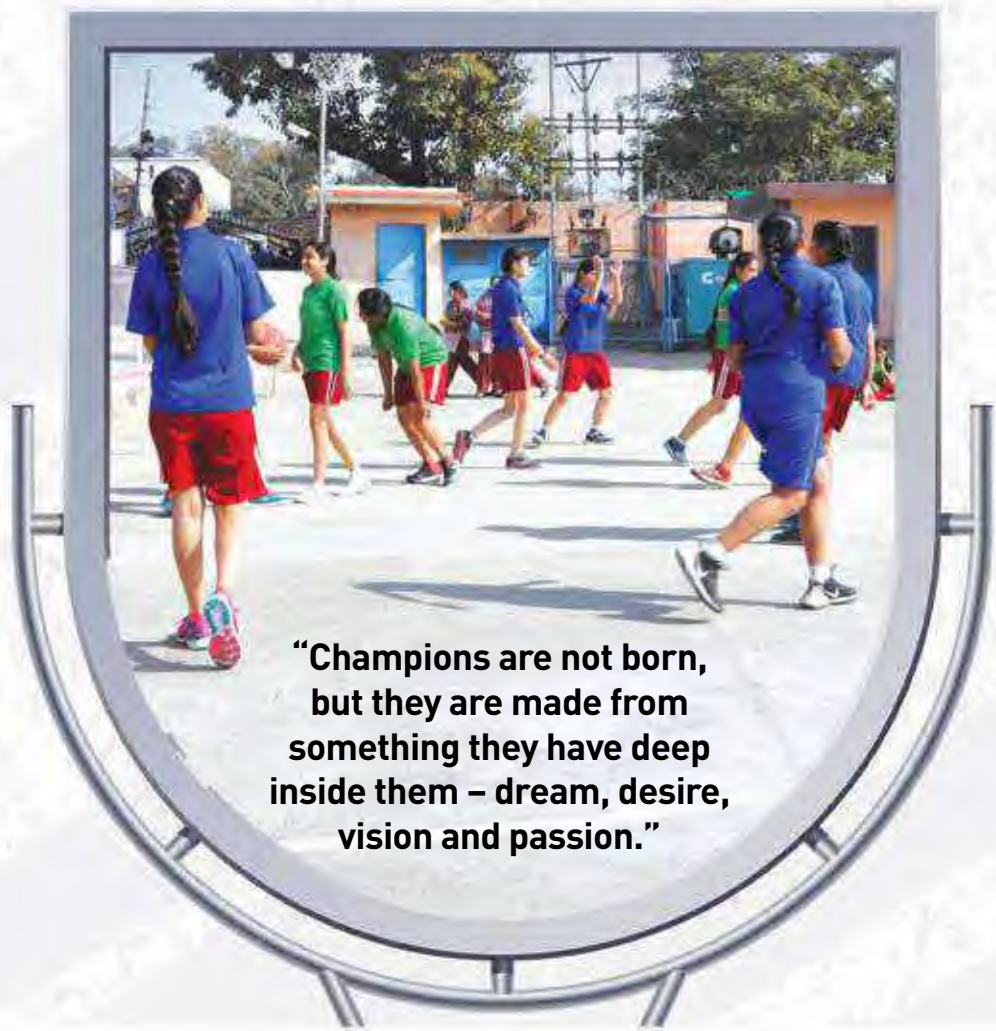


POETRY RECITATION

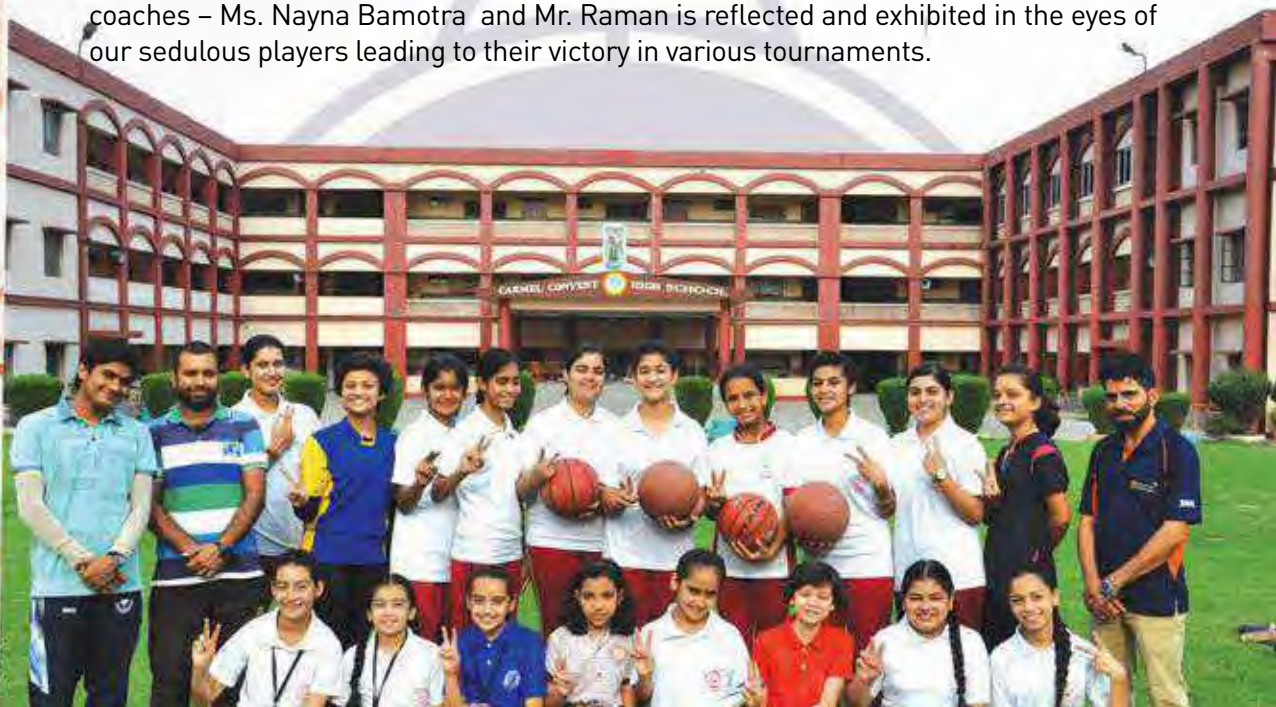

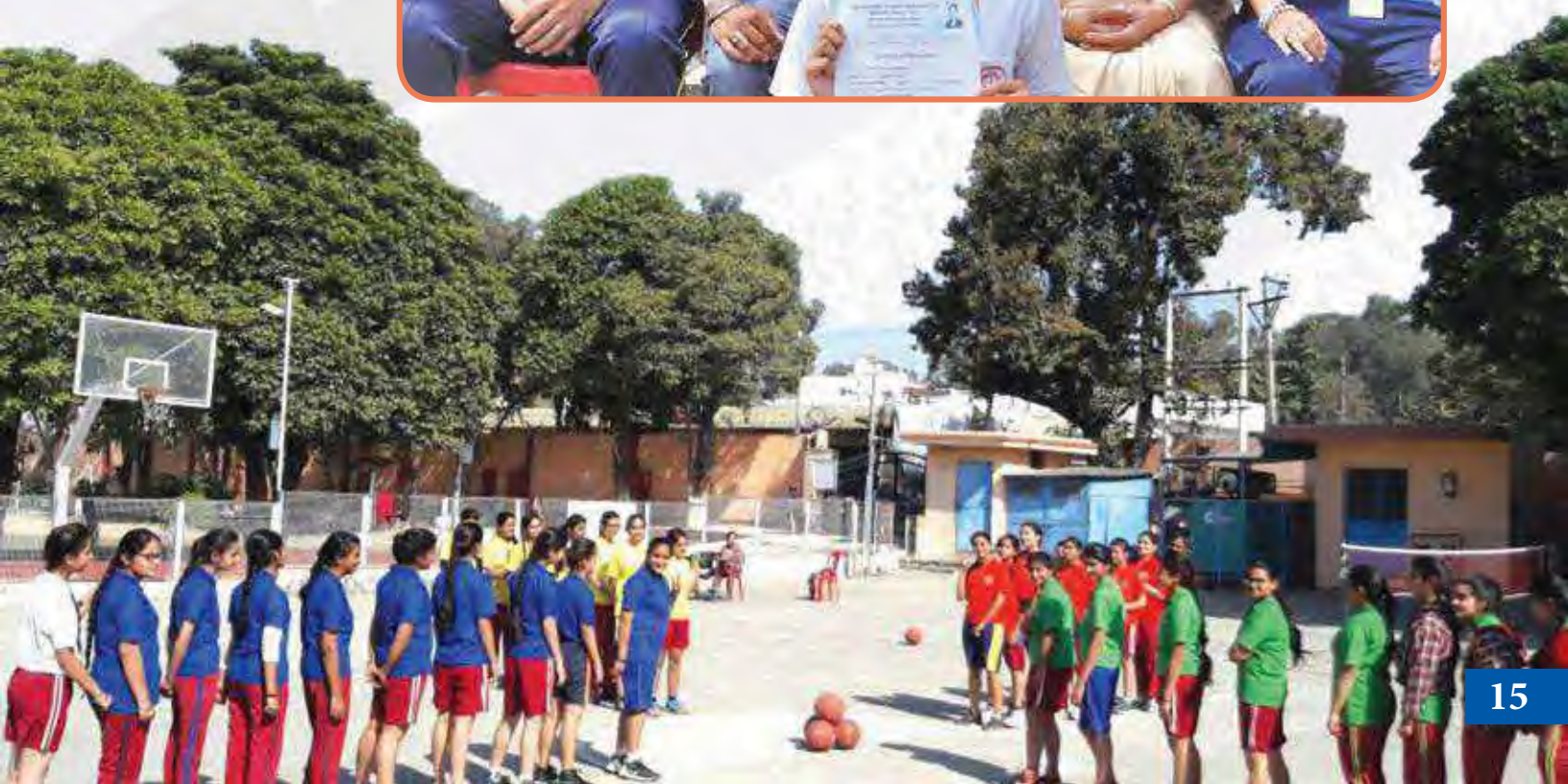

FIELD TRIP

The trip was made to a 'SUNGRACE BEVERAGES' and 'TATA MOTORS' showroom Supwal, Vijaypur. This enriching and educative exposure helped the students to grasp the concepts of centralization, decentralization, Hierarchical structure, Delegation of Authority, Structure of an organization, unity of command and span of control. It was an experience gained by real life exposure.

VISIT TO BOTANICAL GARDEN



The students of medical stream of class 11th visited the botanical garden in the month of November. It was a vast expanse of lush green garden packed with plethora of the most exclusive plants. The garden perfectly epitomizes mother nature in its best form with the Serene surroundings and rare species of plants.

It was a perfect place for the students to make them come close to know the magic of nature. HOD of Botany department informed the students about various techniques and tools used to safeguard extinct and critically endangered species of plants. A professor who takes care of the garden briefed the students about exotic species of plants and their common and medicinal uses. A memory to cherish was to touch the miraculous "Mimosa pudica" that shrinks on being touched.

Students were also taken to the museum of botanical garden where different parts of the plants were preserved and exhibited. Moreover other plant products were also exhibited. Visiting this garden instilled within our students an instinct of protecting and preserving this natural heritage. This trip could take place just because of untiring efforts of our Principal Sr. Maria Swati and Biology teacher.

TRIP TO FISHERIES DEPARTMENT

Field trip, a visit to an area outside of the normal classroom where students try new things, share experience and life lessons is a great methodology of teaching. To ensure better learning and facilitating growth of students of EVS and Biology along with their teacher Ms. Alka Sandhu marched for a field trip to 'Animal Husbandry Department' and 'Fisheries Department' on 5th March 2018, heading towards Central Poultry Farm, Belicharana and Regional Fish Farmers Agency, Ghou manhasaan, Jammu. The first destination visited was Central Poultry Farm, Belicharana where the students were received by Dr. Sandeep



Kotwal (Asst. Poultry Prof. Officer) and Dr. Sunil Kumar (Junior Poultry Geneticist) where they gave a detailed description of various types of poultry animals enlightening on the Chabro breed of hens which included their feeding habits, life style, shelter, breeding, life cycle etc. Students were also involved in performing the process of 'Candling'.

Thereafter they proceeded for 'Regional Fish Farmers Agency, Ghou manhasaan', Jammu. The farm manager Mr. Zakir Khan held a seminar briefing the students about the meaning of agriculture and its relation with fisheries, its importance and various methods and techniques of fish farming. An anatomy of various species of live fish gave more educative facilitation to students. Students also had an opportunity to become familiar with various techniques of fish catching.

This trip encompassed practical knowledge with theoretical concepts, giving a clearer insight of the topic.

SEMINAR ON EFFECTIVE TEACHERS



Motivation is a need for all, be it students or teachers. Motivation is a driving force which drives us all for better performance. Time to time motivation enhances the potentials, enlightens and updates the mind for improvisation and for having an edge for competitions. With this approach in mind, a motivational seminar for the teachers was organized by DIOCESE of Jammu-Srinagar Education Society, which was conducted by Rev. Fr. Joe Arimpore SDB. The theme of the seminar '7 Habits of Highly Effective teachers' emphasized on the fact that effective teachers are Principle Centered Teachers, who along with students can make a difference in creating a new society.

The resource person Fr. Joe Arimpore highlighted the paradigm shift where teaching needs to be student oriented teaching and learning. The technology influenced students need teachers who are well equipped with the changing technology.

He notified that a revolution by teachers needs to be encouraged by inspiring the students to do 'DAAD' (Do An Ark Daily) and CARPE DIEM (Seize the day).

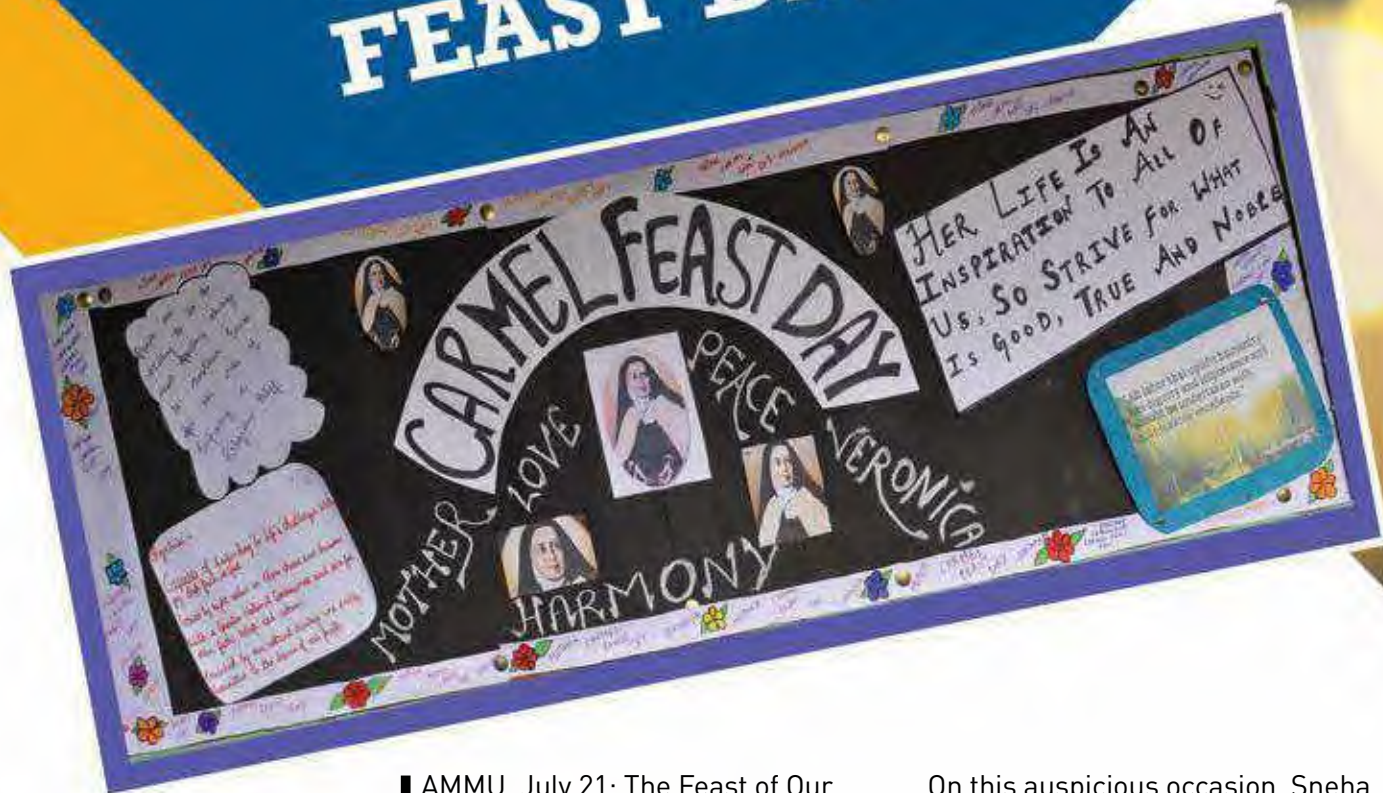

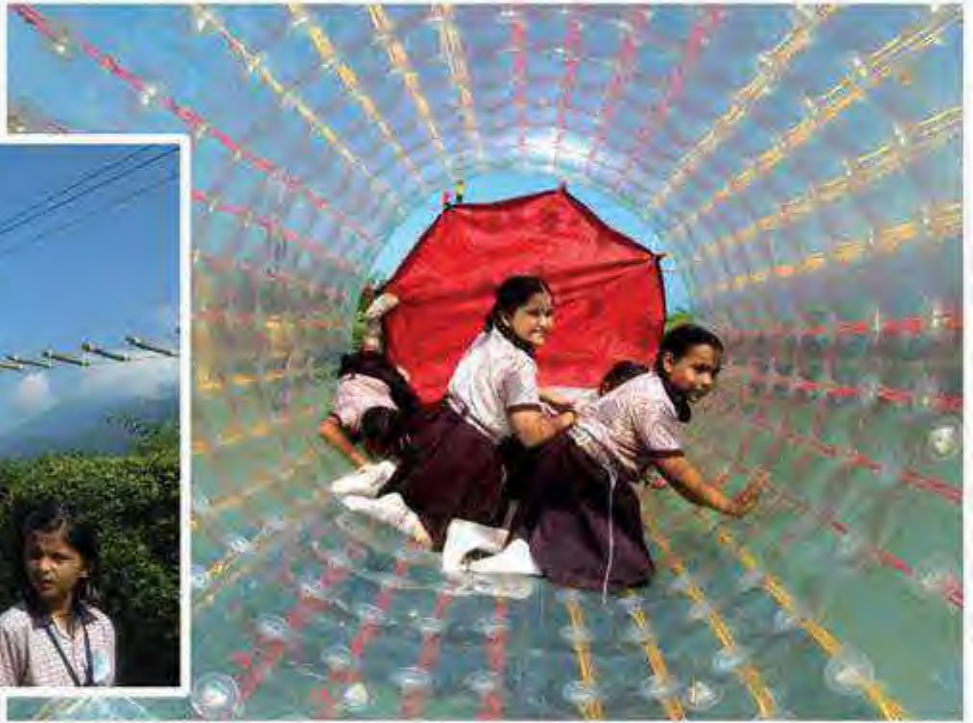
GIRL GUIDES
