Subject: Computer

General Instructions:

Task Assigned:

1. Emerging Trends (AI, AR, VR, IoT, etc.)

"Future Tech Magazine" (Creative Research + Presentation)

Task:

Ask students to create a mini magazine or brochure titled "Future World with Technology".

They should:

Pick any two emerging trends (like AI, AR/VR, IoT, Robotics, etc.)

Write a simple explanation in their own words.

Mention at least 2 real-life applications of each.

Include hand-drawn or printed illustrations/pictures.

Present their magazine in a creative layout (A4 sheets/stapled booklet).

2. Animation in Krita

"Animate Your Name" or "A Moving Scene"

Task:

Ask students to:

Use Krita's animation feature to create a short animation of either:

Their name appearing in a creative way, OR

A simple moving scene (like sun rising, car moving, flower blooming).

Save it as a GIF or MP4 and submit it via pen drive/email.

- 3. "My Voice, My Story" Create an Audio Clip
- 1. Record yourself narrating a short story or a poem (1–2 minutes).

Add background music and sound effects using Audacity.

- 2. Record a short "podcast" where you talk about your favorite hobby (1 minute).

 Add an intro music and fade-out ending.
- 3. Collect 3–4 sound clips (like clapping, birds chirping, water, etc.).

 Mix them using Audacity to create a nature sound scape or mood beat.

Subject - Social science

- 1. Model making:
 - Make a model showing types of resources and their interdependence. (Roll no. 1-30)
 - Make a model of 'Soil profile' (Roll no. 30 onwards)
- 2. Write about the Fundamental Rights and Duties of citizens with real-life examples.
- 3. Write about the structure of courts in India with one real-life case where the Supreme Court gave a landmark judgment.
- 4. Visit a historical site of your city/town. Write a short report on its history , importance and present day condition.
- 5. Map work: Mark regions producing major crops:
 - Rice
 - Wheat
 - Cotton
 - Tea

Tenses Practice: Write 10 sentences about things you did yesterday (Past Tense), 10 sentences about things you do every day (Present Tense), and 10 sentences about things you will do tomorrow (Future Tense).

Prepositions & Conjunctions:

Write 5 sentences using different prepositions (e.g., in, on, under, near, behind).

Write 5 sentences using different conjunctions (e.g., and, but, or, because, so)
